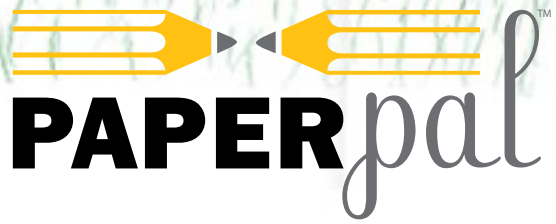
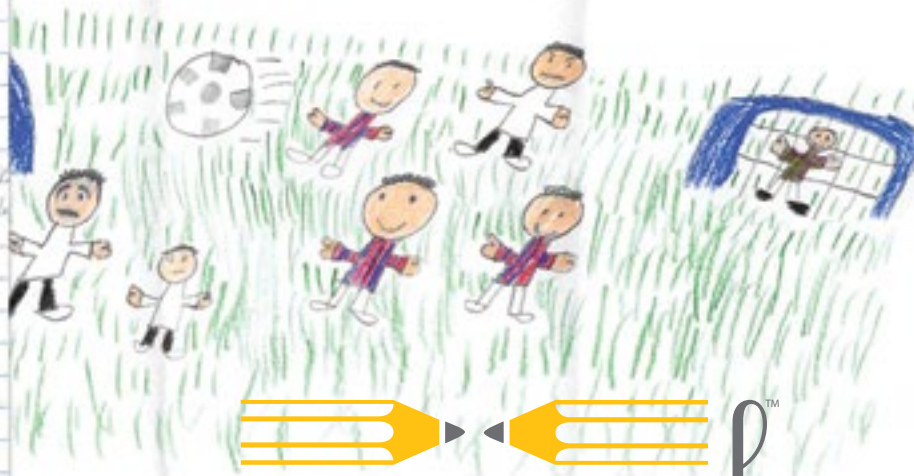


Dear Ms. Turner,

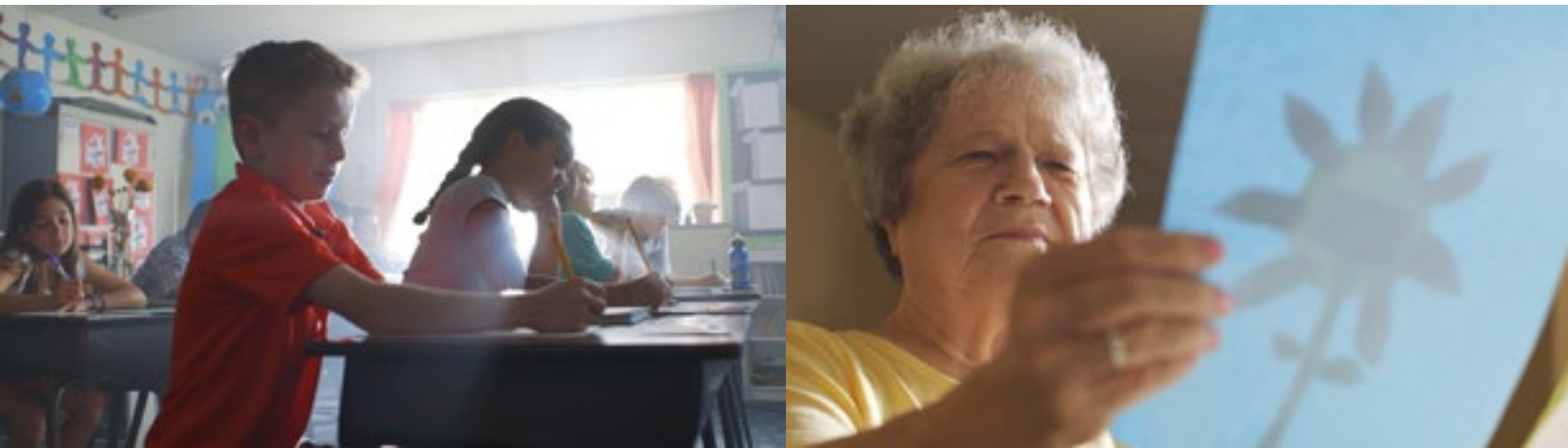


Dear Ms. Rhodes,

How to become a PaperPal.

Connect with a school or senior/retirement/assisted living facility also interested in the program.....it can be across town or across the country! If you need help finding a partner, email paperpal@domtar.com and we will help you to connect. Partner organizations should:

- Identify a lead contact at each participating organization.
- Confirm number of participants at each organization (ideally one for one)
- Select the organization to begin the correspondence and provide names (first names only for children, please)
- Determine the expected frequency of letter exchanges
- Exchange mailing addresses of the organizations (not home addresses)
- Let the fun (and friendship) begin!



We hope this program will allow every participant the chance to connect with different generations and strengthen important areas of the brain activated by handwriting.
